Jumbo Joy Flight – Bringing Smiles and Joy to Disadvantaged Children.



Once a year 350 disadvantaged children who suffer from intellectual or physical disadvantage, life-threatening illnesses, homeless backgrounds or from circumstances where holidays are not possible, get the chance to experience flying in a jumbo jet, thanks to the generous work of The Rotary Club of Turramurra.

The concept was instigated by the Rotary Club of Turramurra's Community Service Committee, headed by Neil Bridge, back in 1973. Since then the annual one-hour flight in a Jumbo 747 has transported more than 14,000 children on the 90-minute flight. These days the organisational efforts for this annual event are expertly led by Mark Hedges (President) and the Turramurra



team who feel passionate about the joy the event brings to so many disadvantaged children.

"The Jumbo flight is an event that gives joy not only to the children, their parents and carers, but to those who are involved from Rotary, Qantas and Pathfinders – many of which have undertaken the flight numerous times. The excitement of the children makes us want to repeat the event year after year" Mark Hedges.

This annual 90-minute magic flight would not be made possible without the generous donations of Qantas who provide the aircraft, their staff - including pilots and crew, who all volunteer their time, Qantas Pathfinders who attend to the ticketing and ground support, Sydney Airport Corporation Ltd who waiver any incurred airport charges as well as Shell Australia who generously donate the fuel.

The Turramurra **Community Bank**[®] branch has been a longtime supporter of this wonderful project. Last November two of the bank staff were fortunate enough to join the festivities and had a fabulous time. Complete with bubble machines, clowns, stickers, children roaming around the plane all with huge smiles on their faces this event clearly changes lives.

Putting Community into Community Banking



On the evening of November 3rd 2016 eight deserving not-for-profits received their Community Grants awarded by the Turramurra and Lindfield **Community Bank**[®] branches.

\$26,206 worth of grants was provided to eight charities and organisations who have helped to support and shape the Ku-ring-gai area.

Pymble Public School and **Cromehurst Specialist School** each received \$5,000 towards much needed playground and equipment upgrades.

Cromehurst Specialist School, which caters to a range of students with moderate to severe disabilities, will now have fitness equipment for its senior students, whilst **Pymble Public School** will be funded to provide new seating for its infants playground. This seating is courtesy of the Ku-ring-gai Community Workshop (Men's Shed), who also received a \$1,500 grant to purchase new nail guns for off-site community projects.

Fresh Tracks Foundation, received their first community grant from the Turramurra and Lindfield **Community Bank**[®] branches late last year, will be using the \$3,674 grant to purchase a recumbent bicycle for Cycle Hub sessions.

This modified bike reclines to allow for easier mobility for those with intellectual or physical disabilities, and will be a welcomed addition to Cycle Hubs, which are unique rehabilitation programs for those who suffer from acquired brain injuries.

A further \$3,500 was granted to the **Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Womens' Shelter**, to provide the crisis accommodation centre with the resources to implement and run an in-house employment program for homeless women.

Studio ARTES, a former recipient in 2009, received \$4,500 for their latest community outreach program, which will provide a new creative arts program to engage with adults living with disability in the area.

Long-time recipient, **KYDS**, who provide free, confidential and highly respected counselling and support services for North Shore adolescents and their families, received \$1,534 to redecorate their waiting room and create a welcoming space for young people and their parents.

The last recipients for 2016 were **Normanhurst Scouts**. With a grant of \$1,500, the Scout Association of Australia will now be able to purchase new abseiling, canyoning and caving equipment for the entire Sydney North Region Scouts.

The menu saw a wide range of wholesome salads, wraps and baguettes introduced along with a summer drinks bar offering fruit smoothies, milkshakes, iced coffee and frappes.

Not only did the menu receive an upgrade, the payment facilities, energy consumption, carbon footprint and waste management all received a review, with new systems introduced.

However, small business is not all delicious bread and frappes; it can be tough starting a new business. Hector and Claudia turned to Turrumurra **Community Bank**[®] to support them through some of the challenges when taking over La Stazione.

"As business owners you can face some tough challenges and you appreciate having someone supporting you throughout," says Hector. "In our case Turrumurra **Community Bank**[®] believed in our project when no other bank did, (and) we are immensely grateful for that. The bank is very collaborative and supportive; they are always keen on helping our business in every way they can," he continues.

It's fair to say Hector and Claudia have settled into the community nicely and enjoy greeting regular customers who stop by on their

Studio ARTES is a leading, independent, not-for-profit creative arts service provider, offering programs that empower people living with disability by tapping into their creative potential. Studio ARTES is a place where all people with any disability can participate in artistic, creative and recreational activities.

The service has been running for 17 years, and has seen over 2000 adults living with a disability benefit from the high-quality programs.

Community volunteers and fundraisers play a crucial part in Studio ARTES success. Unfortunately, in April 2016 Studio ARTES suffered a devastating fire, destroying their entire studio and its contents. The community at large has helped them to rebuild all services and replace vital equipment.

Now operating out of new premises in Jersey Street Hornsby, the focus is on raising funds for the necessary fit-out of the space. This couldn't be achieved without the support of organisations and businesses within the community.

The Turrumurra and Lindfield **Community Bank**[®] branches awarded Studio ARTES a community grant of \$4,500 in 2016, which helped to extend their community outreach programs such as; performances, exhibitions, excursions to film sets, fashion shows and art exhibitions.

A major annual fundraising event for Studio ARTES is their 'Ride a Day in My Wheels'. The event was developed in recognition of 'International Day for People with Disability' by Studio ARTES member and wheelchair user, Oliver House. Pymble Turramurra Pre-School

Pymble Turramurra Pre-school; affectionately known as Handley Avenue is steeped in history dating back to 1958, when a small group of committed Ku-Ring-Gai residents came together with a common vision - to establish a community Pre-school.

Achieving a reputation for excellence within the community over their 50 years in service, due not only to the high standard of teaching staff, but also their core values of respect, sharing, a sense of community, belonging to and a love of their natural environment.



Their lush gardens and overhanging trees create a natural sensory playground for the children to explore. Unfortunately, after routine inspection by local council in July, Handley Avenue was ordered to remove an enormous liquid amber tree that provided a large area of shade for the children.

As one of our valued customers since 2003, the Turramurra **Community Bank®** branch was pleased to be able to step in and provide a community grant towards the replacement of the tree.

The Turramurra **Community Bank®** branch has been an ongoing supporter of Pymble Turramurra Pre-school, providing another community grant back in 2010 for the purchase of two rainwater tanks, as well as providing ongoing support to purchase bikes and scooters for the silent auction at annual fundraising events.
